Kalamunda & Districts Historical Society - A Community Project – Remembering the Railway The Upper Darling Range Railway was built in 1891 to transport our precious jarrah timber from the Hills Forest to Midland and on to Fremantle for export to the rest of the world. Now affectionately known as the Zig Zag the trail can be followed to Canning Mills.

Through the community effort of the Darling Range E -powered Bikers Group, the City of Kalamunda, Kalamunda & Districts Historical Society, the Pickering Brook Heritage Group and the Darling Range Hub a series of signs marking the sidings along the route have been erected. These quite substantial signs contain text and photographs and give the bike riders and walkers a look into

the history of this fascinating part of our history.

The line was taken up in 1949 but in parts of the trail today it is not difficult to imagine the steam train making its way along the 31 kilometres through the bush.



Midland and Districts Historical Society - Midland Town Hall Soldiers Memorial Clock & Tablets 100th Anniversary.



Saturday November 18, 2023 saw the Midland and Districts Historical Society together with the City of Swan acknowledge and recognise the 100th anniversary of the Midland Town Hall Soldiers Memorial Clock and Tablets in Midland with an Open Day.

It was 100 years to the day

that the Soldiers Memorial consisting of the clock and tablets were officially unveiled by the Governor of Western Australia, Sir Francis Newdegate to commemorate the fallen soldiers from World War One who hailed from the Midland area.

The open day provided visitors with an opportunity to take a closer look inside Midland's most iconic building including behind the scenes tours. A collection of photographs of the Midland Town Hall through its history also gave visitors an insight into the times gone by.

Australian Historical Associations Prizes, Awards and Fellowships.

In the recent Centre for Western Australian History Newsletter some links were published for several prizes that may be relevant to some Societies. More information can be found at <u>theaha.org.au.</u>

The <u>Kay Daniels Award is</u> a biennial prize recognising outstanding original research with a bearing on Australian convict history and heritage including in its international context. In accordance with Kay Daniels' values, it is to be an international award. Applications close 31 January 2024.

The Magarey Medal for Biography is

awarded biennially to the female person who has published the work judged to be the best biographical writing on an Australian subject. The 2024 Medal will be awarded for a book published in 2022 or 2023. The award is co-sponsored by the Association for the Study of Australian Literature. Applications close 31 January 2024.

The <u>Serle Award</u> is given to the best postgraduate thesis in Australian history. The 2022 Award will be granted for a thesis passed in the period 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2023. Applications close 31 January 2024

The <u>W. K. Hancock Prize</u> recognises and encourages an Australian scholar who has recently published a first scholarly book in any field of history. 2022 Prizes will be awarded for a work published in 2022 or 2023. Applications close 31 January 2024.



State History Conference 2024

IRWIN DISTRICTS HS (DONGARA) – STATE HISTORY CONFERENCE 2024 – Bruce Baskerville

The 59th State History Conference is being hosted by Irwin Districts Historical Society over the weekend of 6-7-8 September 2024 at The Priory Hotel in Dongara, on the sublime Batavia Coast. Mark these dates in your diary or calendar.

The theme of the Conference is 'Waves of Change'. This partly refers to the diverse maritime and fishing heritage of Dongara and Port Denison, and partly to looking at new developments and ways of doing local history. Both strands are woven through the draft program now being developed.

There will be all the usual features of a State History Conference – a Friday evening welcome to the Irwin shire, a sumptuous conference dinner, fascinating talks and presentations in the Saturday and Sunday mornings with tours and other events in the afternoons.

The conference venue is The Priory Hotel in St Dominic's Road, Dongara. The old Dominican Priory and Dominican Ladies College complex was built in phases between 1881 and 1926 and has an atmosphere richly evocative of the period. It was the setting for a movie shot in 1992 and starring a young Hugh Jackman that was set in 1920s Egypt with its Mediterranean ambiance and encircling date palms.

A program and details will be available in March 2024, but meanwhile all intending conference goers are **strongly encouraged to book accommodation as early as possible**. The conference will coincide with the start of the wildflower season and will be just a fortnight before the King's Birthday long weekend and start of the Spring school holidays. Mining activities elsewhere in the shire are also bringing a high demand for local accommodation. It will be possible to stay at The Priory Hotel – bookings can be made through the Dongara Hotel Motel on 08 9927 1023, where rooms are being held for the conference (just mention that you are attending the conference). However, these rooms are likely to go quickly, so don't tarry if that is your first choice.

Irwin Districts Historical Society looks forward to welcoming you to our little piece of paradise in the same year we will be celebrating our Diamond Jubilee. Just **don't leave your accommodation bookings until the last minute** as the demand is sure to be high.

Meanwhile, we wish our fellow members in the historical society movement all the best for a happy Christmas and New Year break and hope to catch up with you all in delightful (although sometimes very windy) Dongara next year.
