### Perth Zoo over 125 years:

**from the days of the WA Acclimatisation Committee to the current modern zoo, researching and breeding threatened species for release to the wild.**

The talk will delve into the Western Australian Acclimatisation Committee which first met in 1896 and had two roles: to introduce animals from Europe into the Australian environment and to establish a zoological garden. It will cover the 125-year history of the Perth Zoo, from its establishment to its current role as a modern zoo breeding threatened species for release back into the wild.

**Dr Harriet Mills** is a terrestrial zoologist and worked as a Lecturer in Zoology and Conservation Biology for over 20 years before joining the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions in her current role as Program Leader for Perth Zoo Science.
