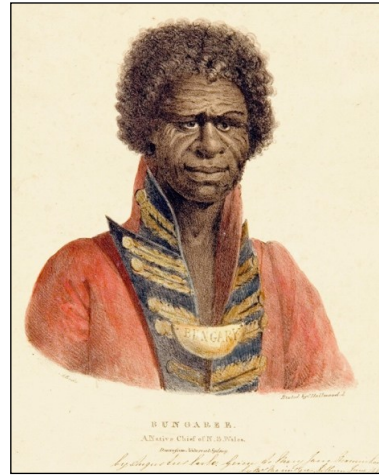




Early Albany: exploring Western Australia's bicentenary
